Dear Elaine, I regret that I cannot be with you on the 17th, but I am including a brief statement if you choose to read it at the meeting.

I am so pleased to hear about the Youth Community Project and regret that I am unable to be present for your meeting. Your vision for local teens is very much needed. In a University town where the primary attention tends to be focused on older youth on campus, the high school students may be neglected. Ever since I came to Chapel Hill in 1959, I have heard parents complain about there not being enough activities for teen-agers. Ironically, the place designated for teens has been located under the old post office, right across the street where younger youth often encounter University youth and try to grow up too soon by the influence of campus life. I commend you for your efforts to provide more activities for these 5,000 younger teens and hope many will join hands with you for filling this gap.
